ZLD Project File	A file created by WindLDR, to operate PLC such as MICROsmart and SmartAXIS Pro/Lite. The file contains user program (laddar program or function block diagram). The file extension is ".zld".
External Memory Device	The generic term for an SD memory card and a USB flash drive.
Command Line	Instructions (commands) written in the Windows command prompt, etc.
HMI Functions	The term refers to the functions such as screens and settings of SmartAXIS that can be created by the WindO/I-NV4.
Control Functions	The term refers to the control functions such as ladder program and setting of SmartAXIS that can be created by the WindLDR.

2.1 Starting Data File Manager

1 Start Data File Manager

The **Connection Settings** dialog box is displayed.

2 Select the **Target Device** from the following items:

PLC, HMI


3 Select the **Port** from the following.

USB, Ethernet, Serial*1

4 Change the settings as necessary.

For details, refer to Chapter 2 "1 Connecting with the PLC" on page 2-1 when **PLC** is selected for the **Target Device**, and Chapter 3 "1 Connecting with the HMI" on page 3-1 when **HMI** is selected for the **Target Device**.

5 Click Connect.




Open the main window of the Data File Manager, and then the status or the system information of the target device is displayed.

Click in the upper-right corner of Data File Manager.


Data File Manager ends.



3 Configuration & Functions

3.1 Data File Manager Configuration

This section describes the names and functions that make up Data File Manager.



Title bar

The title bar shows the name of this software.

Address bar

Displays an address of the target device or a folder path of the external memory device inserted in the target device. The displayed content varies based on the target device. Clicking allows you to edit the displayed content. Press Enter to confirm the change and move to the specified destination.

PLC: For details, refer to Chapter 2 "Address bar" on page 2-6 and Chapter 2 "Address bar" on page 2-7.

HMI: For details, refer to Chapter 3 "Address bar" on page 3-6 and Chapter 3 "Address bar" on page 3-7.



The following characters cannot be used in the address bar:

Toolbar

Display the Data File Manager's functions as buttons. For details, refer to "3.2 Toolbar" on page 1-6.

■ Folder pane

Display the type number, the external memory device and folders.

Details pane

Displays the file operational logs which is in the external memory device inserted in the target device, or the files and the folders selected in the

Operational Log pane

Displays the file operational logs.


4 Customizing the Data File Manager

4.1 Configure the Optional Feature


You can configure the Data File Manager settings such as the double-click action, and the saving the run history of the command line. The settings configured here are saved even when you exit the Data File Manager. The procedure for configuring the optional feature is shown below.

1 Click (Options) on the toolbar.

The **Data File Manager Options** dialog box is displayed.




2 Change the settings on each tab as desired.



Double-click Action Tab

Configure the action when Project File is double-clicked using file manager such as File Explorer.



ZLD Project File (.zld)

This setting sets action for double-clicking a ZLD File. The main window of the Data File Manager doesn't open.

Open the Connection Setting dialog box to download:

Opens the Communication Setting dialog box when you double-click a ZLD Project File. And then download it to the target device via the communication port which you specify in this dialog box.

Start downloading via the USB port: After you double-click a ZLD Project File, starts downloading it to the target device via the USB port.

ZNV Project File (.znv)

This setting sets action for double-clicking a ZNV File. The main window of the Data File Manager doesn't open. Open the Connection Setting dialog box to download:

Double-click the file to display the **Communication Setting** dialog box. The corresponding model set in the project to be downloaded is selected for the **Target Device**.

Start downloading via the USB port: After you double-click a ZNV Project File, starts downloading it to the target device via the USB port.




Double clicking the ZNX project file displays the **Connection Settings** dialog box as well. The corresponding model set in the project to be downloaded is selected for the Target Device and Ethernet is selected for the Port.

Command Line tab

Configures an optional feature of Command Line.



Run History

Save a run history: Save the description of the executed command line to a run history file.

Run History File Location: Specifiy the save location of the run history file. Click ____ to display the **Browse For Folder** dialog box. This option can only be set when **Save a run history** is selected.

Chapter 2 How to use when connecting with PLC


This chapter describes how to use Data File Manager when connecting with the PLC.

1 Connecting with the PLC



1.1 Connection Settings Dialog Box

Configure communication settings to match the connection method from the Data File Manager to the PLC.



Target Device

Select the target device from the following.

PLC: Connects a computer and MICROSmart or SmartAXIS Pro/Lite.

HMI: Connects a computer and SmartAXIS or MICRO/I.

Port

Select the communication port on a computer from the following.

USB: Communicate by connecting the USB port of a computer to the USB interface of the target device.

Ethernet: Communicate by connecting the Ethernet port of a computer to the Ethernet interface of the target

device.

Serial: Communicate by connecting the serial port of a computer to the USB interface of the target device.



When the **Serial** is selected for the communication port, an external memory device inserted in the target device cannot be accessed. However, when **Use Bluetooth communication** is selected, an external memory device inserted in the target device can be accessed.

Product Series

Displays the connectable devices based on the **Target Device** and **Port** settings.

USB Port Settings

This option can only be set when **USB** is selected for the **Port**.

Timeout: Specify the time to (5000 to 32767 milliseconds) wait for a response from the target device.

Retry Cycles: Specify the number of times to execute a reconnection when the target device cannot communicate

with the external device. When the number of reconnect attempts reaches the number of times set

here, a communication error is displayed.

Ethernet Port Settings

This option can only be set when **Ethernet** is selected for the **Port**.

IP Address: Displays the IP address of the target device.

Target List: Specify the IP address and port number for the target device. Click this button to

display the Target List dialog box. For details, refer to "Target List Dialog Box" on

page 2-3.

Network Search: Search for the connectable device(s) on the network via maintenance communication,

and change the IP settings of the target device(s) using the search result. Click this button to display the **Network Search** dialog box. For details, refer to "Network

Search Dialog Box" on page 2-4.

Port Number: Specify the port number for the target device (0 to 65535).

Timeout: Specify the time (3000 to 30000 milliseconds) to wait for a response from the target device.

Retry Cycles: Specify the number of times (1 to 3) to reconnect when Data File Manager cannot communicate with

the target device. When the number of reconnect attempts reaches the number of times set here, a

communication error is displayed.

Serial Port Setting

This option can only be set when Serial is selected as Port.

Port: Select the serial interface connected to the target device from **COM 1** to **COM 256**.

Baud Rate: Select the communication speed with the target device from the following.

1200 bps, 2400 bps, 4800 bps, 9600 bps, 19200 bps, 38400 bps, 57600 bps, 115200 bps

Data Bits: Select the data length as **7 bits** or **8 bits**.

Parity Select the parity from the following.

None, Odd, Even

Stop Bits: Select the stop bits as **1 bit** or **2 bits**.

Timeout: Specify the time (100 to 32767 milliseconds) to wait for a response from the target device.

Retry Cycles: Specify the number of times (1 to 3) to reconnect when Data File Manager cannot

communicate with the target device. When the number of reconnect attempts reaches the

number of times set here, a communication error is displayed.

Automatic Detection: Detects automatically the communication settings of the target device via the serial port.

PLC Network Setting

This option can only be set when Serial is selected as Port.

1:1: Connects with a single target device.

1:N: Connects with a specified target device when there are multiple PLCs on the same network.

Slave Number: Specify the network number (0 to 31) of the target device which set on **Function Area**

Settings in WindLDR.

Download Settings

The maximum data size: Specify the maximum size of the communication packets (1 to 64 (64 bytes units)).

Adjust this size if the remote device does not have enough communication buffer.

Time delay between packets: Specify the communication interval (0 to 3000 milliseconds) between the

communication packets. Adjust this interval if Data File Manager sends communication

packets to the remote device too fast.

Communication Option

This option can only be set when **Serial** is selected for the **Port**.

User Bluetooth communication: Select this check box to communicate with the target device over Bluetooth

communication.

For steps to use Bluetooth communication, refer to chapter 9 "BLUETOOTH COMMUNICATION" in the "FC6A Series MICROSmart Communication Manual".

Default


Returns the configured values to their default values.

Connect

Starts communication with the specified target.

Target List Dialog Box

The IP settings for the target device is collectively managed.



(Target List)

IP Address: Displays the IP address registered in the Target IP Address Settings dialog box.

Port Number: Displays the port number registered in the Target IP Address Settings dialog box.

Comment: Displays the comment registered in the Target IP Address Settings dialog box.

Add

Adds the IP address settings of the target device to the (**Target List**). Click this button to open the **Target IP Address Settings** dialog box. For details, refer to "Target IP Address Settings Dialog Box".

- Fdit

Changes the settings of the (**Target List**). Select the setting to change from the (**Target List**), and then click this button to open the **Target IP Address Settings** dialog box. For details, refer to "Target IP Address Settings Dialog Box".

Delete

Deletes the selected settings from the (Target List).

Target IP Address Settings Dialog Box

Specify the IP settings of the target device used for communication.



IP Address

Specify the IP address of the target device. The format is "xxx.xxx.xxx.xxx". "xxx" must be replaced with a numeric value from 0 to 255.

Port Number

Specify the port number for the target device (0 to 65535).

Comment

Enter a comment for the IP settings. The maximum number is 80 characters.

Default

Returns the configured values to their default values.


Network Search Dialog Box

Display the information of the target device found by searching on the network and change their settings.



- The search targets FC6A-D16**CEE and FC6A-D32**CEE only.
- The MAC address cannot be changed.
- The port number is not displayed because it cannot be changed.
- To perform the following operations, the IP Settings/DNS Settings Switching function must be enabled in the project of the target device.
 - Change the content of search results
 - Select the check box to the left of the MAC address

For details, refer to "Chapter 3 IP Settings and DNS Settings Switching" in the FC6A Series MICROSmart Communication Manual.



(Target List)

Click **Search** button to display the settings of the target devices found by searching on the network.

Clicking the cell allows you to change the settings. To write the changed settings to the target device, select the check box to the left of the MAC address to change, and then click **Apply**.

MAC Address: Displays the MAC address of the target device.

IP Address: Displays the current IP address configured to the target device. Click the cell to change the

value. The format is "xxx.xxx.xxx.xxx". "xxx" must be replaced with a numeric value from 0 to

255.

Subnet Mask: Displays the current subnet mask configured to the target device. Click the cell to change the

value. The format is "xxx.xxx.xxx.xxx". "xxx" must be replaced with a numeric value from 0 to

255.

Default Gateway: Displays the current default gateway configured to the target device. Click the cell to change

the value. The format is "xxx.xxx.xxx.xxx". "xxx" must be replaced with a numeric value from

0 to 255.

Preferred DNS Server: Displays the current preferred DNS server configured to the target device. Click the cell to

change the value. The format is "xxx.xxx.xxx.xxx". "xxx" must be replaced with a numeric

value from 0 to 255.

Alternate DNS Server: Displays the current alternate DNS server configured to the target device. Click the cell to

change the value. The format is "xxx.xxx.xxx". "xxx" must be replaced with a numeric

value from 0 to 255.



The meanings of the display colors of the character in (**Target List**) are as follows:

Black: Search results.

Red: Settings have been changed after the search results were displayed.

Green: The changed settings have been applied to the target device.

Network Adapter

Select the network adapter to use with your computer. Only network adapters that are enabled on your computer are displayed.

(Progress bar), (Status message)

Displays the progress and results of processing when using the **Search** or **Apply** button.

Search

Searches the network and displays the information of the target device(s) responded in (Target List).

Apply

Writes the settings changed in (**Target List**) to the target device. This button is enabled only when any or all of the check boxes to the left of the MAC addresses are selected.


Select

Returns to the **Connection Settings** dialog box, and setting the IP address and port number configured to the target device of the MAC address in the selected line from the (**Target List**).
